Costume Information

Dancers will be wearing their dress code items, (see below for details) just like they wear to class. Other fun costume accessories will be given to the dancers when they arrive at the venue.

Micro Mini Age 4-5

- Peacock or Cerise or Black Coloured Cap Sleeve Bodysuit (no buttons, snaps or zippers)
- Black Indoor Runners
- Beige Bodyliner
- Black Bottoms

Mini's Age 6+

- Copen or Black Coloured Cap Sleeve Bodysuit (No buttons, snaps, or zippers)
- Black Indoor Runners
- Beige Bodyliner
- Black Bottoms

Petite's Age 9+

- Navy or Black Coloured Cap Sleeve Bodysuit (No buttons, snaps, or zippers)
- Black Indoor Runners
- Beige Bodyliner
- Black Bottoms

Juniors Age 12+

- Black Bodysuit (Any Style)
- Black Indoor Runners
- Beige Bodyliner
- Black Bottoms

Seniors Age 14+

- Bodysuit (Any style, Any Colour)
- Black Indoor Runners
- Beige Bodyliner

***Please make sure no undergarments are visible. Tights may act as underwear.**

Hair Information

- Long hair 4 & up is to be in a ballet bun on the nape of the neck with no flyaways, 3 & under a high ponytail on the crown of the head with curly hair.
- Short hair is to be positioned neatly away from the face.

Makeup Information

Makeup is worn by performers on stage so that the dancer's faces are visible under the stage lights. We recommend wearing makeup as shown on the chart below so that you can see your dancer's smiling face onstage, however, make up is not mandatory.

- Black indoor runners
- Black cotton pants, (no pockets)
- Fitted white t-shirt (no logo)

Hair Information

- Hair tied back neatly off of face

Makeup Information

Dark Brown eyeshadow

Eyeliner (6 on chart)

Black

Mascara (on top and bottom eyelashes)

Lips

Lipstick (7 on chart)
